The National Society of Black Engineers (NSBE) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization dedicated to the academic and professional success of Black engineering and technical students and professionals. NSBE offers its members leadership training, professional and academic development, mentoring opportunities, community service outreach programs, and scholarships.

Mission: To increase the number of culturally responsible Black engineers who excel academically, succeed professionally and positively impact the community.

Organization: NSBE is one of the largest student-managed associations in the country, comprised of more than 600 chapters nationwide and overseas. These chapters are geographically divided into six regions and are governed by a national executive board.

Membership: NSBE has more than 24,000 active collegiate and professional members. Its membership has also grown to include over 3,600 pre-college students in addition to chapters in Africa, Asia, Canada, the Caribbean, and Europe.

#### GENERAL BODY MEETINGS

#### ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE WORKSHOPS

Academic excellence events help our members to not only succeed in their classes, but also acquire skills that will make them stand out in the job market. Some examples of these workshops are: note taking workshops, test prep workshops, Python workshops, 3D printing workshops and more.

#### PRE-COLLEGIATE INITIATIVE EVENTS

Our chapter hosts events catered to K-12 students in the community. These events are to help increase interest in going to college and pursuing STEM degrees in Black students and other minorities.



## Programs & Events National/Regional Events

#### REGION 2 LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE

The Regional Leadership Conference (RLC) is targeted specifically towards Chapter and Professional leadership. Attendees receive three days of position-focused training, professional and leadership development, and an opportunity to network with peers throughout the region. The goal is that leaders leave RLC with the knowledge and tools to be successful as the Model Region and a connection to the NSBE mission. With these new skills, attendees will be able to take their chapters to the next level as they all strive to meet the new regional objectives.

#### ZONE SUMMITS

Zone summits allow our chapter to network and fellowship with other chapters within our zone, the "Terror" zone, to get to know each other as well as participate in activities and workshops catered to this specific zone. The "Terror" Zone is a subset of Region 2 and consists of Maryland, Washington D.C., & Northern Virginia.

#### FALL REGIONAL CONFERENCE

The Fall Regional Conference (FRC) is our region's very own mini-Convention before the entire Society reconvenes for Annual Convention in the spring. During FRC, you can expect to see revolutionary programming and workshops that will focus on cultural development, financial literacy, leadership development, academic success and much more. Additionally, FRC will see opportunities for Region II's membership to further their professional careers at our Career Fair where they will be able to connect with companies seeking interns and full-time employees.

#### ANNUAL NATIONAL CONVENTION

The Annual Convention showcases Black students and professionals who have a passion for Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM), who are high achievers in these fields and who are channeling their dedication to advance their communities and society at large. This convention will usually attract more than 10,000 aspiring and practicing engineers, educators, representatives of more than 200 academic institutions, government agencies, corporations and nonprofit organizations.

The convention features high-profile speakers, panel discussions, dynamic workshops, networking sessions, community engagement events, technical and scientific competitions, hands-on engineering and science activities and the premier career fair geared toward Black people in STEM.
